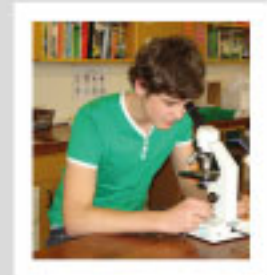


Why Choose Biology?

Assessment Information

A Level Units

AS Unit 1 - Biochemistry and Cell Organisation - 1 hour 30 minutes written examination that makes up 20% of qualification.

AS Unit 2 - Biodiversity and Physiology of Body Systems - 1 hour 30 minutes written examination that makes up 20% of qualification.

A2 Unit 3 - Energy, Homeostasis and the Environment - 2 hours written examination that makes up 25% of qualification.

A2 Unit 4 - Variation, Inheritance and Options - 2 hours written examination that makes up 25% of qualification.

A2 Unit 5 - Practical examination comprising of an Experimental Task and Practical Analysis Task that make up 10% of qualification.

Entry Requirements

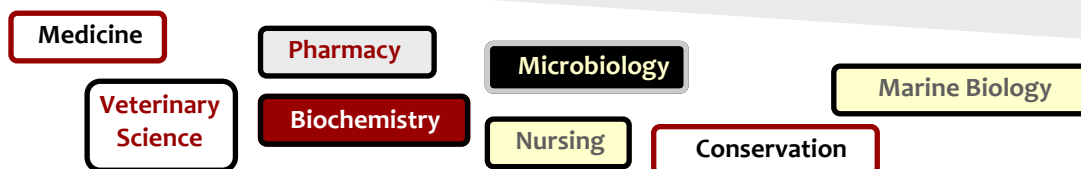
You should have achieved at least BB in double awards Science or a grade B in GCSE Biology and a grade B in **either** GCSE Maths or Numeracy.
