AS Unit 2 - Language Issues and Original and Critical Writing - 2 hours written examination that makes up 20% of qualification.

A2 Unit 3 - Language over Time - 1 hour and 30 minutes written examination that makes up 20% of qualification.

A2 Unit 4 - Spoken Texts and Creative Re-casting - 2 hours written examination that makes up 20% of qualification.

A2 Unit 5 - Language and Identity - non-exam assessment that makes up 20% of qualification.

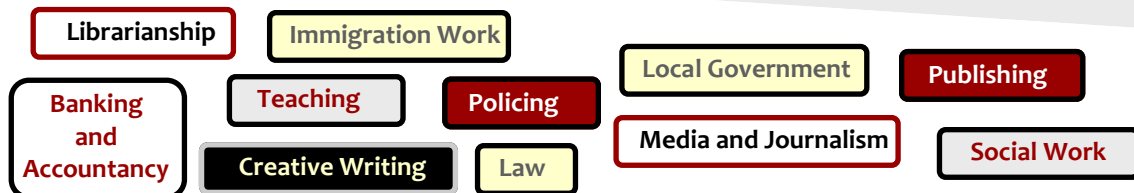
Entry Requirements
