AS Unit 1 - Changing Landscapes - 2 hours written examination that makes up 24% of qualification.

AS Unit 2 - Changing Places - 1 hour and 30 minutes written examination that makes up 16% of qualification.

A2 Unit 3 - Global Systems and Global Governance - 2 hours written examination that makes up 24% of qualification.

A2 Unit 4 - Contemporary Themes in Geography - 2 hours written examination that makes up 16% of qualification.

A2 Unit 5 - Individual Investigation - 3000-4000 words written non-exam assessment that makes up 20% of qualification.

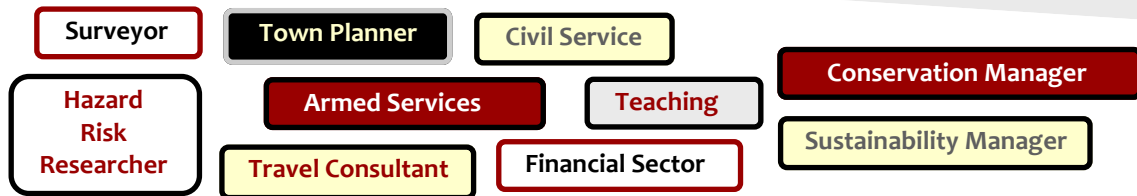
Entry Requirements
