A2 Unit 8 - Understanding Human Behaviour - external written examination that makes up 10% of qualification.

A2 Unit 9 - Working in Health and Social Care - internal coursework that makes up 15% of qualification.

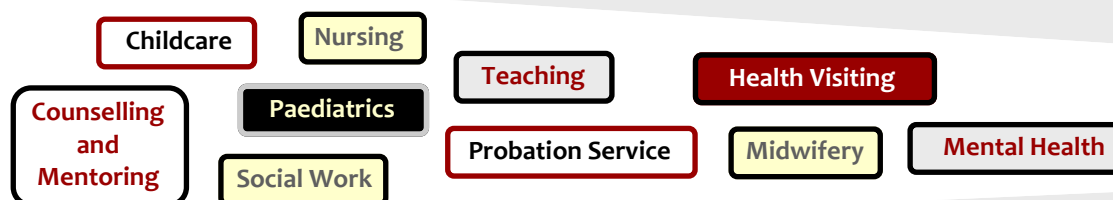
A2 Unit 11 - The Role of Complementary Therapies In the Care of Individuals - internal coursework that makes up 15% of qualification.
