The Law of Torts will involve you in exploring remedies available to those who have suffered harm due to the negligent actions of others. By studying Criminal Law you will also explore offences against property or the person, pleas of insanity or self-defence and consider concepts such as attempted crime and conspiracies to commit a crime.

Assessment Information

A Level Units

AS Unit 1 - The Nature of Law and the Welsh and English Legal Systems - 1 hour and 45 minutes written examination that makes up 25% of qualification.

AS Unit 2 - The Law of Tort - 1 hour and 15 minutes written examination that makes up 15% of qualification.

A2 Unit 3 - The Practice of Substantive Law: Criminal Law and Human Rights - 2 hours written examination that makes up 30% of qualification.

A2 Unit 4 - Substantive Law Perspectives: Criminal Law and Human Rights - 2 hours written examination that makes up 30% of qualification.

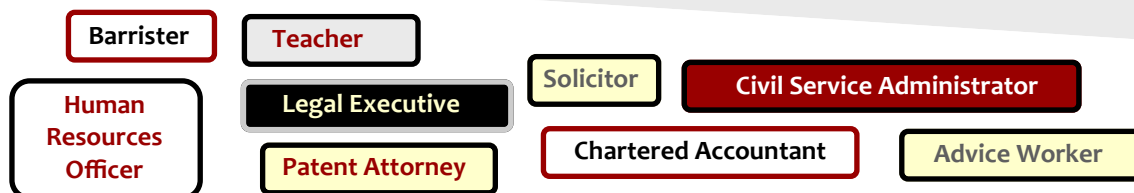
Entry Requirements
