There will also be an opportunity to participate in lessons provided by Flintshire Music Service. Music will enable you to develop your range of musical skills including analysing, creating, depth of listening and score-reading and expanding your knowledge of a wide range of music.



Choose Music as an option and you will be able to contribute to musical events, both as a soloist or as an ensemble player or singer, throughout the year. These will include Soloist Evening, Guitar Evening, the Christmas Concert at St Mary's Church in Mold, Vocal Evening and the Summer Serenade. A Level Units

AS Unit 1 - Performing - 6-8 minutes performance that makes up 12% of qualification.

AS Unit 2 - Composing - 3-6 minutes composition that makes up 12% of qualification.

AS Unit 3 - Appraising - 1 hour and 30 minutes written examination that makes up 16% of qualification.

A2 Unit 4 - Performing - Option A: 10-12 minutes performance that makes up 22% of qualification.
Option B: 6-8 minutes performance that makes up 14% of qualification.

A2 Unit 5 - Composing - Option A: 3-6 minutes composition that makes up 14% of qualification.
Option B: 5-9 minutes composition that makes up 22% of qualification.

A2 Unit 6 - Appraising - 2 hours and 15 minutes written examination that makes up 24% of qualification.

Entry Requirements

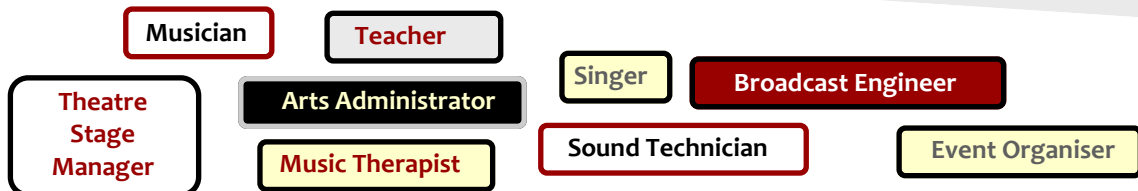
You should have achieved a grade C or above in GCSE Music to help develop your skills further within Performing, Composing and Appraising.

We will accept students without a Music GCSE qualification as long as you can demonstrate a high level of musicianship achieved through the study of the voice or an instrument and currently take part in County Ensembles.
