Assessment Information

A Level Units

AS Unit 1 - Technical Principles, Designing and Making Principles, Analyse and Evaluate - 2 hours written examination that makes up 20% of qualification.

AS Unit 2 - Design and Make Task - approx 40 hours non-exam practical assessment that makes up 20% of qualification.

A2 Unit 3 - Technical Principles, Designing and Making Principles, Analyse and Evaluate - 2 hours 30 minutes written examination that makes up 30% of qualification.

A2 Unit 4 - Design and Make Project - approx 60 hours non-exam practical assessment that makes up 30% of qualification.

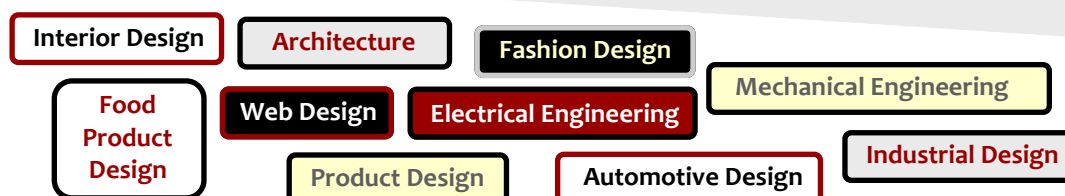
Entry Requirements
