

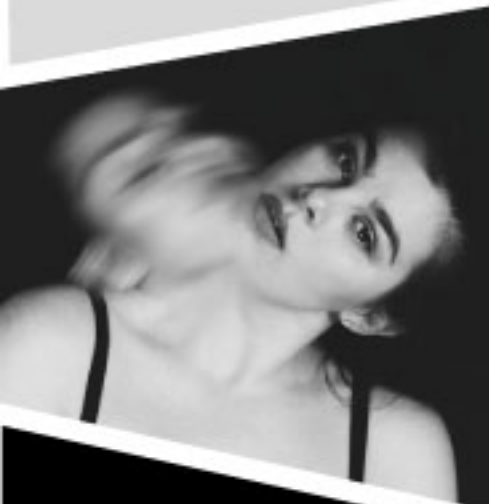
Why Choose Photography?

Photography allows you to develop your creative and technical skills as well as bringing your own interests into the subject.

Studying Photography gives you the opportunity to utilise a range of equipment including SLR cameras, bridge cameras and iPads and to work in a dedicated computer suite using specialist editing programmes. These include Adobe Photoshop and Illustrator.

Assessment Information

A Level Units

AS Unit 1 - Personal Creative Enquiry - non-exam assessment that makes up 40% of qualification. This consists of a practical project/portfolio and outcome/s.

A2 Unit 2 - Personal Investigation - non-exam assessment that makes up 36% of qualification. This consists of a practical project/portfolio and outcome/s and a written element of 1000 words.

A2 Unit 3 - Externally Set Assignment - non-exam assessment that makes up 24% of qualification. You will be provided with a series of visual and written stimuli. One stimuli is to be selected and you will produce preparatory work in response to this leading up to a 15 hour period of sustained focus work which will be done under supervised conditions.

Entry Requirements

You should have achieved a grade C or above in GCSE Art and Design or a design-related subject.

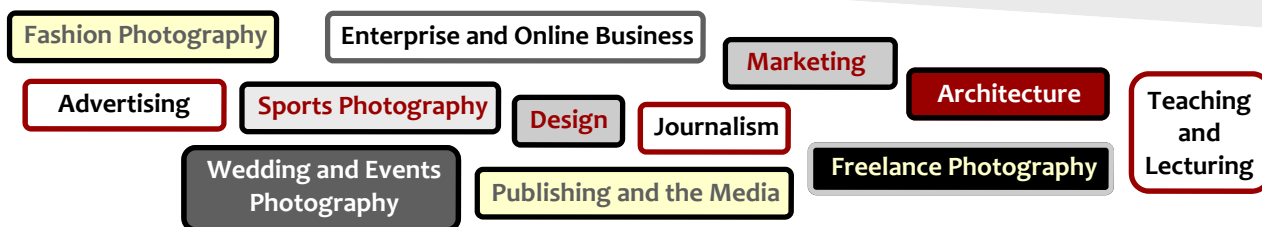
Progression Routes
