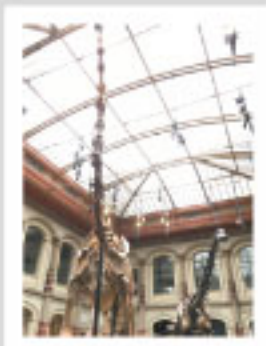


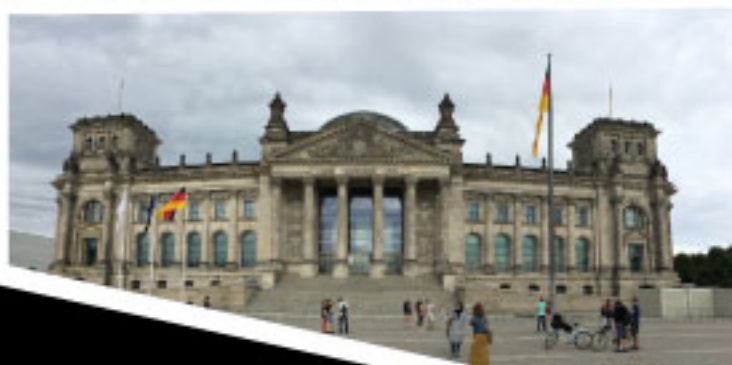
Why Choose German?

Assessment Information

A Level Units

AS Unit 1 - Speaking - topic-based conversation and discussion that makes up 12% of qualification.

AS Unit 2 - Listening, Reading and Translation and Critical Response in Writing - 2 hours and 30 minutes written examination that makes up 28% of qualification.

A2 Unit 3 - Speaking - independent research project and discussion that makes up 18% of qualification.

A2 Unit 4 - Listening, Reading and Translation- 1 hour and 45 minutes written examination that makes up 30% of qualification.

A2 Unit 5 - Critical and Analytical Response in Writing - 1 hour and 30 minutes written examination that makes up 12% of qualification.

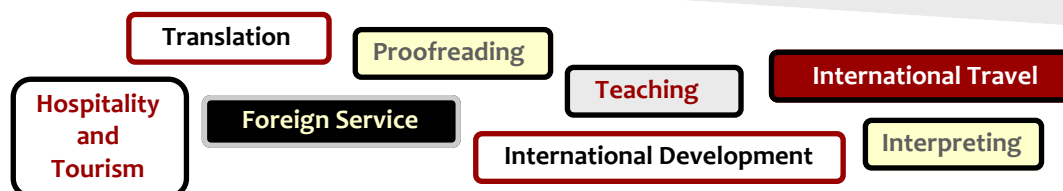
Entry Requirements
